

Discover the habitats of Attenborough

- **Reed beds:** Look carefully among the whispering reeds for warblers, wading birds and nature's fishermen such as heron and bittern. This habitat provides them with safe nesting sites and a good supply of larvae, insects and small fish, known as 'fry'.
- **Willow and Alder Carr:** Here you will probably hear woodpeckers drilling into the trees for bugs or making nesting holes. Spend time in this ancient habitat looking for woodland birds, beetles and mini-beasts.
- **Ponds and Rivers:** Attenborough's watery world is a great attraction to migrating birds. You may be lucky to see some rare species passing through. There are always plenty of resident birds to enjoy throughout the year.
- **Grassland and Scrub:** In spring and summer enjoy the wildflowers attracting insects, butterflies and nesting birds.
- **Marshland:** Through the winter large numbers of Snipe and Water Rail feed in the marshland areas.
